Information Sheet

Starting Your Swag

Set Up

Hang your Swag in a shady place from a strong point

Wet Bedding Material to the same dampness as the bedding material in the worm bucket.

Put damp bedding material into the bottom of the Swag.

Put worms on top of bedding material.

Replace Swag top.

Feeding Your Worm Farm

Feed your worm farm organic scraps from your kitchen, garden or pet droppings.

Do not feed citrus or onion family as it is too acidic.

Do not feed bread or carbohydrates.

Do not feed meat or dairy products.

Feed small amounts at a time.

Overfeeding will kill your worms!

Use a sprinkle of agricultural lime weekly.

Water sparingly.

Keep Out of the Sun!!!
